## 2004 BROADCAST JOURNALISM SCHOLARSHIPS

### 2004 Scholarships

#### Ed Bradley \$10,000 Scholarship

*A \$10,000 award established by 60 Minutes Correspondent Ed Bradley. Preference given to an undergraduate student of color.*

#### Ken Kashiwahara \$2,500 Scholarship

*A \$2,500 award established by former ABC News Bureau Chief and Correspondent Ken Kashiwahara. Preference given to an undergraduate student of color.*

#### Carole Simpson \$2,000 Scholarship

*A \$2,000 award established by ABC News Correspondent Carole Simpson. Preference given to an undergraduate student of color.*

#### Lou and Carole Prato \$1,000 Sports Reporting Scholarship

*This \$1,000 tuition grant is given to a deserving student with strong writing skills who is planning a career as a sports reporter in television or radio.*

#### Mike Reynolds \$1,000 Scholarship

*Preference given to undergraduate student demonstrating need for financial assistance by indicating media-related jobs held and contribution made to funding his or her own education.*

#### Presidents' \$2,500 Scholarships

*Two awards given in honor of former RTNDA Presidents Theodore Koop, Bruce Dennis, James McCulla, John Salisbury, Bruce Palmer, Dick Cheverton, Jim Byron, Ben Chatfield and John Hogan. Only currently enrolled college sophomores, juniors and seniors in good standing are eligible to apply.*

#### Abe Schechter \$2,000 Graduate Scholarship

*Applicant must be an incoming or full-time graduate student. Instead of a tape, submit a one-page essay detailing your merits and career objectives.*

*The RTNDF scholarship program is supported by individual donations, the Barney Oldfield/George Foreman Founder's Fund, and Dow Chemical.*

### ALL APPLICANTS:

- ❖ Must be officially enrolled in college and have at least one full academic year remaining.
- ❖ Must be a fully enrolled college sophomore or higher. (Freshman are not eligible).
- ❖ May apply for only one scholarship.
- ❖ May be enrolled in any major so long as your career intent is television or radio news.

### PLEASE INCLUDE:

1. A completed application form, clearly identifying the scholarship for which you are applying.
2. A copy of your resume.
3. One to three examples showing your journalistic skills, totaling 15 minutes or less, on audio cassette or video (VHS only) cassettes, accompanied by scripts. (International applications must include a full English translation).
4. A brief statement describing your role (writing, editing, producing, reporting, videography) in each story and a list of colleagues, if any, who worked on each story and what they did.
5. A one-page statement explaining why you seek a career in broadcast or cable journalism, with reference to your specific career preferences (radio or TV; reporting, producing or newsroom management). Management and graduate award applicants need only send one essay.
6. A letter of reference from your dean or faculty sponsor explaining why you are a good candidate for an award. The letter must also certify that you have at least one or more years of school remaining.
